Disability Employment Services

Disability Employment Services are contracted providers of government employment services and support. They help eligible people with disability, injury or health condition to find and keep a job.

Disability Employment Services providers are experts at connecting people with disability to prospective employers. They work directly with people with disability to help them get a job by getting to know their skills, qualifications, prior work experience and career goals. They know where the jobs are and how to help people with disability find and retain one.



When a person with disability has been placed in a job, a Disability Employment Services provider will give them employment support for at least 26 weeks, but may be able to help both the employee and employer for as long as is needed.

For employers, Disability Employment Services can provide a range of free services, including help to employ and retain young workers with disability.

To find out if you can get help from Disability Employment Services contact the Department of Human Services (Centrelink). You may also be able to directly register with a Disability Employment Services provider in your area.
